



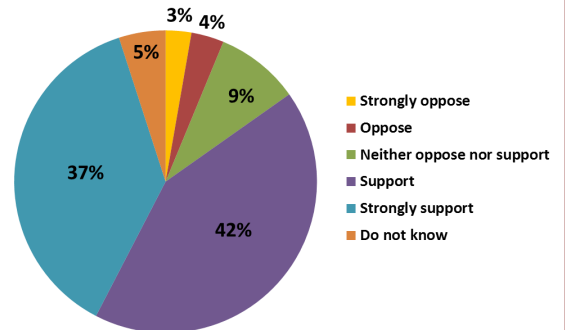
# 2012 Wind Energy & Wildlife Survey Results

## Omaha Public Power District

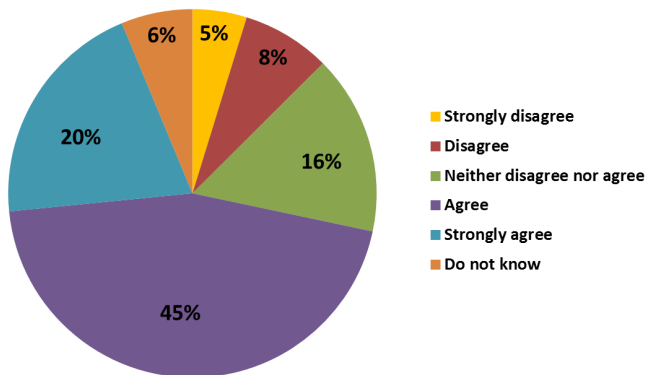
The Nebraska Wind Energy and Wildlife Project submitted eight questions to the 2012 Nebraska Annual Social Indicators Survey (NASIS).

- 948 Nebraskans responded to the wind & wildlife survey questions
- 405 (43%) were residents in the Omaha Public Power District (OPPD) service area
- All results listed in this handout are from OPPD residents

Do you support or oppose wind energy development in Nebraska?



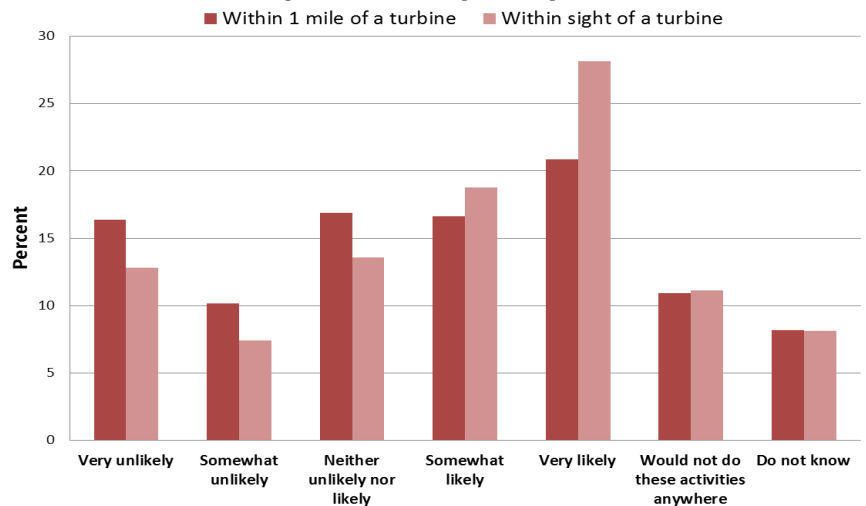
Do you agree or disagree that wind energy facility (i.e. wind farm) development and operation should have to take precautions to reduce impacts on wildlife?



- 65% of OPPD respondents agree or strongly agree that wind energy facility development and operation should have to take precautions to reduce impacts to wildlife
- 13% disagree or strongly disagree that precautions should have to be taken

OPPD respondents are more likely to recreate within sight of a turbine than within one mile of a turbine.

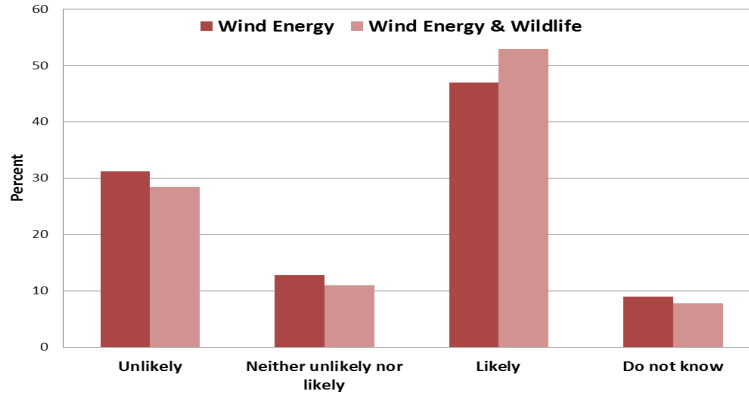
How likely or unlikely are you to recreate...





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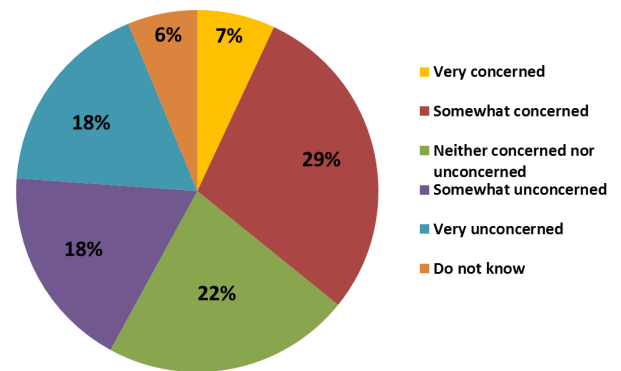
How likely or unlikely are you to pay \$2 more a month on your electricity bill to support ...



OPPD respondents are more likely to pay \$2 more a month on their electric bill to support wind energy if it is planned in a way that reduces impacts to wildlife.

- 36% of OPPD respondents are concerned that birds and bats can be killed as a result of wind energy development
- 22% are neither concerned nor unconcerned
- 36% are unconcerned that birds and bats can be killed as a result of wind energy development
